# **SUPERINTENDENT**

## **BOARD APPRECIATION**

With this month being board recognition month, it is important for the public to know that the people that make up a local school board have a significant impact on school operations running smoothly. The members of this board take their position very seriously and work collectively with each other and the superintendent to provide our students with quality opportunities in education, school activities, and career information while remaining fiscally conscious.

On January 28, 2020 there will be a board recognition meal provided by Mrs. Betts' class followed by a board retreat. The purpose of the retreat is to review the status of the district currently and over the next year.

## **COMMUNITY SERVICE RECOGNITION**

It is my pleasure to recognize Mrs. Kathy Miller on behalf of the current school board for her years of service to the children of NBCSD and to the community at large. We are thankful to have people like Kathy that is proud of the community and school district in which she lives and is always willing to help the children in our school district.

## **FISCAL INFORMATION**

The local auditor has completed the audit for the 18-19 school year. Over the past few years, Northern Bedford has been very conservative in the budgeting process to save money for future expenditures. The 18-19 budget year closed approximately \$598,000 dollars in the black. We were fortunate to receive a \$100,000-dollar Education Grant and not required to pay one month of our health premiums. Unfortunately, our state legislative body continues to fail public brick and mortar schools because they have not been able to pass common sense legislation that would fix the cyber school cost debacle.

The district is giving serious consideration of major projects over the next 4-5 years totaling over 2.2 million dollars. These include the HS/MS windows, the elementary roof, floor tile in HS/MS, and auditorium to name a few.

Given the financial circumstances, it will be difficult for the board to not strongly consider some level of increase in taxes to compensate for additional expenses. Although, NBC has many external forces for which we cannot control, we will continue to provide those items vital to the education of our students; we will also strive to keep the programs we have in place as we can all recognize the value they have for our students.

## **ELEMENTARY**

### **Community Service**

In December, elementary school students collected coats, hats, and gloves in participation with the High School Student Council coat drive. Over 470 coats were collected between the three schools with elementary students donating over 270 coats.

### **Community Organizations in the School**

Several community groups have been grateful and included the elementary school students in some fun and valuable activities. In November, the Rotary provided dictionaries to our third grade students. In December, the Cove Community Club hosted Santa Claus and visited our preschool and kindergarten classes. They provided cookies and milk and a gift for each student. Last week the Martinsburg VFW Auxiliary presented a flag etiquette program to grade three students. We appreciate all the groups that take the time to share with our little Panthers.

### **End of Marking Period**

January 14 is the end of the second marking period. Kindergarten through grade 5 report cards will be distributed and sent home on January 21.

### **Reading Competition**

Practices begin this month for the reading competition that will be hosted at Bedford Middle School on March 26. Mrs. Brown is the Reading Competition advisor for the elementary-aged students in grades 5 and 6.

### **Bowling Trips**

Our annual bowling trips to the Martinsburg Park began on January 6 and continue through February 10. Two classrooms from grades 3-5 visit the park on Mondays. Mr. Brumbaugh, the elementary PE teacher, plans and organizes this trip for the students.

### **Elementary Music Program**

Mrs. Jones led the elementary students in several musical activities in the past several weeks. The 2<sup>nd</sup> grade students performed their second grade musical on November 19 in the MPR. The 5<sup>th</sup> grade class performed their Christmas musical on December 10 in the auditorium. Mrs. Jones prepared the "Singing Around the Christmas Tree" activity that all of our little Panthers participated in on December 19. We appreciate her time and the time of all the teachers shared making these fun and worthwhile activities possible.

### **Job Shadowing**

This job shadowing experience along with our Grade 7 CEW fulfill part of the new PDE requirements in regards to career awareness/readiness. Career awareness/readiness are a measure of the newly implemented PA Readiness Index that is used to give school districts an SPP score.

### **PRIDE**

The following table shows the total discipline referrals and the average daily attendance in the middle/high school for the past four years from the first day of school through the last day of school in December for the respective school year. The School-Wide Positive Behavior Intervention and Support program was initiated during the 2017-18 school year.

There was a significant decrease in the number of discipline referrals from 2016-17 to the 2017-18 school year. This school year, we have 50% fewer referrals than the base year. The average daily attendance has shown an increase from 2016-17. While the current year attendance is slightly lower than 2017-18, the first year of implementation, our daily attendance has shown an increase since the inception of our PBIS program.

### **Spelling Bee**

Eighth grader Randy Harris won the annual Middle School Spelling Bee held on December 20. Alyssa Yeatts, Grade 6, finished in second place while Adam Johnson, Grade 8, finished in third place.
